This summer we are asking all students to read two books of their choice! We encourage you to choose books that you would enjoy reading.

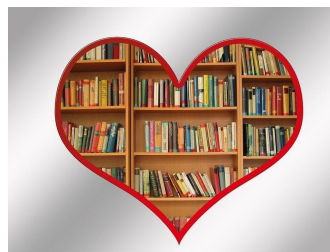
